Medicaid also provides hospice benefits in many states, especially for those who meet certain financial criteria. For those with private insurance, most plans include hospice care as part of their benefits.

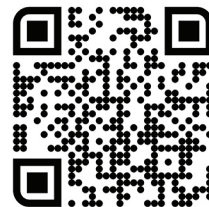

Our dedicated team crafts a personalized care plan, focusing on alleviating pain and managing symptoms, while also nurturing emotional and spiritual well-being.

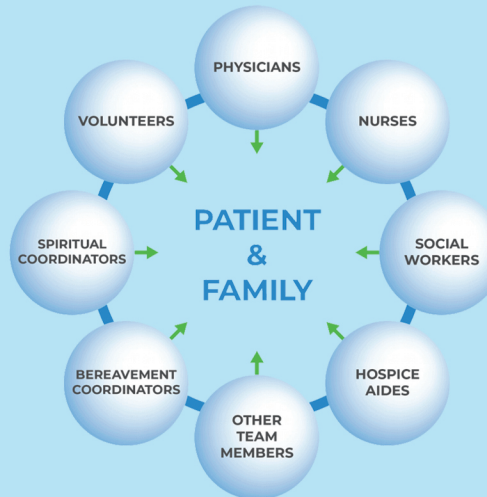
